Nine Stormers flew our flag on the Grand Canal in Dublin, teaming up with a group of American paddlers to form the Dublin or Nothin' crew to compete at a mini international regatta. They proved to the younger crews that age is no barrier to paddling prowess! And they displayed real Stormer discipline in the boat despite their more vocal crewmates having plenty to say before, after and DURING the races! The Nothins were third (to the composite Irish/English and the Germans) in the 200 metre dash and second to the Germans over 400 metres in the mixed category. Our women's crew came in fourth to the English 2013 European championship U30s crew, County Carlow and the host club team. The Irish paddlers were thrilled that the Aussies had come such a long way to compete and our crew song was such a hit, several encores were performed!

The Australian team of 316 paddlers won 63 medals (16 gold, 30 silver and 17 bronze) from 83 races. It is the best result ever by Australia at a world championship event.
